DIESEL TRANSPORTATION TECHNOLOGY

Providing Careers for the Long Haul



If you're looking to work on the big rigs

– an 18-wheeler – the tractor and trailer

– the life blood of America—then Triton

College's Diesel Transportation Technology

(DTT) Program has a place for you!

The DTT Program is the only program in the area for those who are interested in receiving a certificate or even an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree. This program was created to address the industry's shortage of technicians and to meet the aspirations of the student body to learn about trucks and powertrain systems.

Allan Hertko, chairperson of Triton's Diesel/ Truck Programs, said there are many opportunities available to those who enter this booming industry! He feels that the "sky is the limit," noting that it really depends on "an individual's goals and work ethic."

"Skilled technicians are in huge demand to help identify and prevent premature failures, and to repair a variety of vehicle systems," said Hertko. "Today's trucks are equipped with many comforts and safety features we have seen in the automotive world for many years and decades. With today's safety regulations, a driver will have a modern vehicle that will keep a 53-foot trailer within the lines and will assist the driver in blind-spot situations to avoid accidents, lane assistance, and forward and side radar systems."

Hertko added, "Currently, repair facilities are looking for well-trained personnel who





can handle complicated network and check engine light diagnostics and handle a preventative program. Community members have inquired over the years about both trucking and diesel engine certificates."

Students earning certificates can start around \$25 an hour or more. Those in the field could seek employment in an original equipment (OE) specific dealership such as Peterbilt or

Ford, or they could work in a fleet management and repair facility, such as The Custom Trucking, Inc. in Northlake, a local general repair facility or for a municipal entity, such as a local village, the city of Chicago or the state of Illinois.

"DTT is a way for students to broaden their horizons," said Hertko. "We have the right equipment and instructors to help assist, teach and develop future technicians right here at Triton!"

To complete this program, students will take a variety of classes, such as Introduction to Automotive Technology, Electricity and Electronics I/II, Drivetrain I/II, Engine Repair, Steering Suspension, Heating, Ventilation and Cooling (HVAC), and Preventative Maintenance. Those interested must enroll in Introduction to Automotive Technology to begin their process of receiving a certificate.

Since Triton's program has received approval from the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) for an A.A.S. degree, it will take students a total of five semesters and approximately 61 credit hours to complete.

Hertko added that students learn the comprehensive theory, operation and diagnostic skills needed in today's world to repair multiple vehicle systems. Current and

> future vehicle systems are very complex with introductions of electric vehicles (EV) and other alternative fuel. The market will need motivated technicians to make precise repairs.

"Freight companies and customers need reliable working tractors and trailers to move products from one coast to the other," said Hertko. "These trucks run 24 hours a day, 365

days a year. Companies want and need a flawless vehicle without a major downtime repair. Any overlooked item can cost a fleet or owner operator a lot of money. Freight never stops moving."

PLACEMENT TESTING

Triton College expects all students to either possess at the time of admission or acquire through appropriate developmental coursework, the basic reading, writing and mathematical skills that are necessary for success in the course or program of study chosen by the student.

Therefore, Triton College requires all entering students wishing to enroll in credit classes, to take institutional placement tests or provide formal documentation of basic learning skills. See advisor for exceptions.

Students scoring in the developmental range on the English placement test must enroll in appropriate college reading and/or writing courses prior to the completion of 12 academic credit hours. New students must complete testing or submit documentation to be exempt prior to attending orientation or registration.

Students with previously earned college credit may be waived from placement tests if they personally bring in a college transcript or grade report showing successful completion of a college-level English composition/rhetoric course or mathematics course with a "C" or better. **New transfer students** need to bring a transcript or grade report to their orientation program. **Returning students** should bring appropriate documentation with them at the time of registration. 

Tuition

The tuition rate is based on your permanent residence. To be considered a resident of District 504 a student*:

CAREER/Joint Agreements

The Comprehensive Agreement Regarding the Expansion of Educational Resources (CAREER) allows out-of-district students to earn an Associate of Applied Science degree or certificate at in-district tuition rates if the program is not offered at the community college in their district. PAY by Nelnet Tuition Payment Plan

To help you meet the expenses at Triton College, we offer a convenient monthly budget plan for students with a tuition balance of at least \$250. Nelnet gives you two options for making monthly payments.

You may make payments by either automatic bank payments or by charging payments to your Discover Card, MasterCard or American Express. Because Nelnet is not a loan program, there is no debt incurred, no credit search, and no interest or finance charges assessed on the unpaid balance. Nelnet charges a \$25 per semester nonrefundable fee to enroll and participate in its program. Students who opt to use the credit card option also will incur a credit card convenience fee.

You are responsible for paying tuition for all classes for which you have registered. You should not assume that you have automatically been dropped from classes if you don't pay for them by the due date. Be sure to drop any class you do not wish to take.

If you register, fail to attend and fail to officially withdraw from classes, you are still responsible for the tuition. Students who receive grades but do not pay will be subject to collection fees when the account is turned over to the college's collection agency.

How Nelnet Tuition Payment Plan Works

You must enroll online. Go to triton.edu/MyTriton for instructions on how to log on to the student portal. Once you log in, select Enroll and Manage My Payment Plan from the Financial Information pull-down menu. After you submit your online agreement, a confirmation email will be sent to verify your agreement.

You may budget your tuition and fees one of two ways:

- A. Automatic Bank Payment (ACH) ACH payments are those payments you have authorized Nelnet to process directly with your financial institution. It is simply a bank-to-bank transfer of funds that you have preapproved for your tuition at Triton College. Payment can be made from either your checking or savings account. Payments are processed on the fifth of each month and will continue until the balance due to the college is paid in full.
- **B.** Credit Card Option If you elect to use this option, monthly payments along with a convenience fee will be charged to the Discover Card, MasterCard or American Express as designated at the time of origination. The convenience fee is in addition to the Nelnet nonrefundable enrollment fee. Payments will be charged on the fifth of each month until the balance is paid in full.

Completing the Nelnet Agreement

When you enroll online be sure to have the following information:

- Your student ID number.
- The name and address of the person responsible for making the payments.
- · Account information for the responsible person.
 - 1. If paying by automatic bank payments, you will need bank name, telephone number, account number and the bank routing number. Most of this information is located on your check.
 - 2. If paying by credit card, you will need the credit card number and expiration date.

Nelnet Pending Aid Payment Plan

Nelnet Pending Aid Payment Plan is available for eligible students applying for financial aid. An eligible student is one that has an expected family contribution (EFC) of \$5,900 or less (based on their FAFSA on file in the Financial Aid Office). The \$25 Nelnet processing fee is deferred until the plan is activated. If the student's financial aid award covers all institutional charges, the plan is canceled with no penalty. If the student has an incomplete file, or a balance due after the financial aid award has been applied to their account, the student can choose to pay the balance due in a one-time payment and the plan will be canceled with no penalty, or the plan will activate and the \$25 Nelnet processing fee will be charged to the student along with the first of the monthly installments.

STUDENT PHOTO ID CARD

A student identification card may be required to access various services on campus. An ID is required for admittance into the Educational Technology Resource Center, to check out materials in the Library and for discounted admittance to student events. You may obtain your ID at the Welcome Center in the Student Center. Two forms of identification are required: your current class schedule and a picture ID. There is no charge for the initial ID, however, there is a \$5 replacement charge if lost.

STUDENT GRADE REPORTS

Final grades are available online on your Student Portal at **MyTriton.triton.edu**. Student Grade Reports are not mailed.

REFUND POLICY

A student who registers, fails to attend class, and fails to officially withdraw from the class, is still responsible for all tuition and fees. A student who receives grades for a class, but does not pay, will be subjected to collection fees when the unpaid balance is turned over to a collection agency.

A student who officially withdraws from any class may be refunded to a percentage of the course tuition depending on when withdrawal is made (see the following table). The registration, late registration, proficiency test and special examination fees are not refundable. The auxiliary and student services fees are refundable only when official withdrawal occurs before the start of the semester.

REFUND

A student is entitled to a 100% refund when official withdrawal is made no later than the first 5.5% of the class calendar days. A 50% refund will granted within the first 5.6-8% of the class calendar days. Withdrawals after the 100% refund period will result in a grade of "W".

Students should refer to their current class schedule in the MyTriton portal for specific withdrawal dates for each term.

All requests for exceptions to this policy must be made in writing on a General Petition form and submitted to the Welcome Center in the Student Center within one calendar year of the semester in dispute. For more information, you may obtain a guide to refund petitioning at the Welcome Center.

Tuition Refunds/Credit Vouchers for Students Called to Active Military Service

Any active student who is required to withdraw from classes during his/her regular semester or summer term due to active military obligations will be entitled to a full refund of tuition or credit voucher (unless paid by a state/federal agency) upon evidence and notification to the college within the semester or term of withdrawal.

ATTENTION ALL STUDENTS

Get an early start on the financial aid application process for the 2023-2024 academic year by applying now at **FAFSA.gov**.

Students may complete and submit the 2023-2024 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) now.

This year's application has been available since Oct. 1, 2022. Some federal and state grant programs have limited funding and students are awarded based on first-come, first-served basis. Therefore, it is important to submit the FAFSA as early as possible in order to receive consideration for all funding sources.



Where do I start?

The FAFSA must be completed and submitted to determine the student's eligibility for federal and state grants, Federal Stafford Loans, and Federal Work Study. Students may apply on the web at fafsa.gov. Triton College's school code (001773) should be entered on the FAFSA to ensure that our office receives your results. If assistance is needed in completing the FAFSA, students may bring their/their parents' appropriate year's tax returns (1040, W-2s, and any schedules) and other documents that verify income to the Financial Aid Office and a staff member will guide the student through all the steps needed in order to complete the FAFSA.



The Triton College Placement Test:

ACCUPLACER®



Success begins with your placement test!

The ACCUPLACER placement test has three parts: Reading (20 questions), Math (12 to 32 questions), and Writing (20 questions). All test subjects are not timed, multiple choice and computer-based. It is recommended that testers allow one and a half to two hours to complete the test.

Outside materials and personal calculators cannot be used on the test. A calculator icon will be available in the test platform for use on specific math questions. Scratch paper and pencil will be provided.

Students may be waived from one or more placement test subjects if they have successfully completed college courses in English and math, have qualifying ACT or SAT scores, or a qualifying high school GPA. The measures used for math placement are applicable for 18 months while the measures used for English are applicable for three years.

Test takers must complete a Triton College application at **triton.edu/application** before taking the placement test. A valid ID with the test taker's name and photo is required to test. There is no fee for the first attempt.

Placement testing is scheduled appointments only. No walk-ins at this time.

How Can I Prepare?

As in any testing situation, you can do your best by following a few basic tips:

- Review the practice testing material before you take the test. The review material includes information about key
 concepts contained in the test. After you complete a review of the concepts, you can take a practice test and get
 feedback about your knowledge.
- Relax! The ACCUPLACER test is designed to help you succeed in school.
- You will be able to concentrate better on the test if you get plenty of rest and eat properly before the test.
- You should arrive a few minutes early so you can find the testing area, restrooms, etc., and have time to gather your thoughts before the test begins.
- Be sure you understand the directions for each test before that test session begins. Ask questions if you need to.
- Read each question carefully until you understand what the question is asking. If answering an item requires several steps, be sure you consider them all.
- Be sure to answer every item. You are not penalized for guessing. Your score will provide more useful placement information if you answer every item, even if you guess.
- Don't be afraid to change an answer if you believe that your first choice was wrong.
- If you have a problem or question during the test, raise your hand and the test administrator will help you. Although they cannot answer test questions for you, they can help you with other types of problems.



Tuition

The tuition listed at the end of each course entry includes these rates. For example:

The first amount is in-district tuition, the second amount is out-ofdistrict tuition and the third amount is the special rate for in-district older adults (age 60 and over).

All tuition is subject to change without notice.

Fees

Students enrolled in "E" noncredit/vocational courses (i.e. PSY E01) are assessed fees totaling \$16 per Adult Education Credit hour (AEC). This includes the Registration, Auxiliary, Technology, and Student Services fee.

Students enrolled in "C" noncredit/personal enrichment courses (i.e. PED C01) are assessed a \$7 registration fee per course. Students registering for multiple "C" courses are eligible for a refund of any registration fee balance over \$7 and should contact the Continuing Education main office.

The registration fee is waived for in-district senior citizens age 60 years and older. In the event a student cancels a course, the Registration fee will not be refunded.

Extension Centers

Meeting dates for classes held at extension centers generally follow the schedules and/or school calendar of that center. When a center is closed because of local scheduling, severe weather or some other condition that makes holding class impossible, that class meeting will be canceled and rescheduling arrangements will be made at the next class meeting.

Refund Policy

One hundred percent refund up to three business days (9 a.m.-5 p.m.) prior to the start of the class. No refunds will be granted after this time. No-shows do not constitute cancellation.

Requests for exception to the refund policy must be stated in writing on a General Petition or letter to the dean, Continuing Education Department and submitted to Room A-201 of the Learning Resource Center within one calendar year of the semester in dispute.

All refund checks are mailed. Credit card payments are refunded by credit card and check payments are processed 10 working days after check receipt.

Veterinary Assistant Program

Veterinary assistants are critical members of a veterinary staff. Learn the practical skills needed to assist veterinarians and veterinary technicians as you care for sick and injured animals. Learn how to assist with medical procedures, customer relations and examinations. Students will also learn how a veterinary hospital operates by focusing on billing, workplace safety and marketing in an externship. This 150-hour Veterinary Assistant Program prepares students for entry-level positions in the veterinary field. Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to demonstrate the practical skills needed to become a valuable veterinary assistant.

Career Outlook

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), employment in the veterinary assistant field is expected to grow 19 percent through 2026, which is much faster than the average for all occupations. Veterinary assistants and laboratory animal caretakers work mainly in clinics, animal hospitals and research laboratories. Their work may be physically and emotionally demanding. Salaries vary depending on experience, hours and location.

Educational Requirements

Most employers prefer that veterinary assistants have a high school diploma or equivalent.


EKG TECHNICIAN PROGRAM

Pharmacy Technician Program

HOLA

Pharmacy technicians work under the supervision of licensed pharmacists to perform technical duties in the systematic operation of the pharmacy providing health care services and medications to patients. This 75-hour course will introduce students to various settings in pharmacy practice, including the community, hospital, managed care, mail order and long-term care. Information on qualifying for the pharmacy certification examination will be provided. Technicians may perform many of the same duties as pharmacists. However, all of a technician's work must be checked by a pharmacist before medicine can be dispensed to a patient.

Career Outlook

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), employment of pharmacy technicians is projected to grow 20 percent from 2012 to 2022, faster than the average for all occupations. Several factors will lead to increased demand for prescription medications. Depending on the position, the technician may also manage third-party billing, answer telephones, direct customers to items or to the pharmacist for medication consultation, receive written prescriptions, clean and sterilize dispensing bottles and instruments, answer questions regarding non-drug products and operate a cash register.

Educational Requirements

High school diploma or equivalent. Since pharmacy technicians interact daily with co-workers, patients and health care professionals, good communication and interpersonal skills are essential. It is recommended that students take the math placement exam to ensure their ability to do basic college math.



Travel north on the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) and exit onto the Eisenhower Expressway (I-290), heading east toward downtown Chicago. Exit the Eisenhower at First Avenue and turn left (north). Travel to North Avenue, turn left and drive west to the next stoplight, which is Fifth Avenue. Turn right and drive north on Fifth Avenue to the next stoplight. Main campus will be on your left.

From the East

Travel west on North Avenue to Fifth Avenue (one block west of First Avenue). Turn right and drive north on Fifth Avenue to the next stoplight. Main campus will be on your left.

From the West

Travel east on North Avenue to Fifth Avenue (just past the Winston Plaza Shopping Center). Turn left and drive north on Fifth Avenue to the next stoplight. Main campus will be on your left.

From the North

Take the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) south to the Irving Park Road exit (Illinois 19) and head east to River Road. Turn right (south) on River Road. Stay to the right at Fifth Avenue to reach the main campus (second stoplight).

PLEASE NOTE: There is NO exit from the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) at North Avenue.

Triton College is easy to get to by train or bus...

From the South

Take the Douglas train to the end of the line. Exit at the Cicero-Berwyn stop and take the 322 bus west to Cermak and First Avenues. Then take the 331 bus north to the Triton campus.

From the East

Take the Congress train to the end of the line. Exit at the Des Plaines stop and take the 17, 303 or 310 bus west to Madison and Fifth Avenues. Then take the 331 bus north to the Triton campus.

OR


Take the Lake Street train to the Austin or Harlem exits. Take the 309 or 313 bus west to Lake Street and Fifth Avenue. Then take the 331 bus north to the Triton campus. If you are looking for an alternate route, exit at Harlem Avenue and take the 318 bus to North and Fifth Avenues. You can then walk three blocks to campus.


From the North and Northwest

Take the O'Hare train to Cumberland Avenue. At the Cumberland exit, take the 331 bus directly to the Triton campus.


